Vacancy Science staff member

CPB Netherlands Bureau for Economic Policy Analysis conducts scientific economic research that is used by policymakers and politicians in the decision-making process around policy issues. As a scientific staff member, you will be working on complex issues, which you will address from various and sometimes unexpected perspectives.

We recruit scientific staff within various sectors of CPB.

Recruitment

CPB, generally, recruits new staff twice a year. Traditionally, this takes place in the first quarter (January), to fill the vacancies at various sectors. People who are completing their education in the current academic year, therefore, are also explicitly invited to apply. More information about the procedure is published on the CPB website.

Job description

You will be working on policy-relevant economic studies, within a team of higher educated professionals. You will be setting up and executing policy analyses, among other things, and work on the practical application of economic or statistical theory, in addressing complex issues. At some point in the future, you will become responsible for setting up and conducting high quality research. This will involve answering questions, including those from the Cabinet and Ministries. When doing so, you will take various interests and external developments into account. You will be using and/or developing mostly scientific methods and techniques, and will publish and present the results from independent analyses for a variety of target audiences in the fields of policy and science. CPB will offer you the opportunity for career advancement, such as a promotion to experienced senior scientific researcher.
